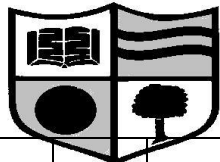

4.4 GOV 2018/2019	7.05	Report of the Head Teacher - paper	<p>Data - The first part of the report is the data missing at the Teaching and Learning meeting.</p> <p>Year 6 if performing at this level will be at national average but there is a lot of work happening in providing interventions to help the children achieve more. The expected percentage will be in the 70's.</p> <p>When is the SATS?</p> <p>In the last weeks of the next half term.</p> <p>Year 5 have been tested on Year 6 tests and that is a stronger</p>	

		<p>cohort and so this time next year should be higher.</p> <p>Is the 63% correct? Yes Year 4 is also a strong cohort. Year 3 at this moment will be lower if they were sitting the SATs this year but there are a number of intervention in the year group.</p> <p>Is AD happy with the progress? There is a mix of up and down within the subjects. Year 2 are the strongest cohort in the school. Year 1 phonics with the issue is boys who are being targeted. The boys have potential and the school is extending their progress by the Thrive programme and targeted interventions.</p> <p>What is the number of boys? It is 5 boys. LQ has been in to school and seen the intervention working in year 1. TB arrived at this time.</p> <p>Computer The network in school has been mapped. There will be costs for the website and the filtering system. AD is organising the filtering system. The capital fund will be used for this outlay and then a monthly bill. The cost will be about £1200 a year.</p> <p>GDPR The parents will be asked for positive permission and this can be done through the school gateway.</p> <p>Think Sheets There is a report on Think Sheets from EC and one child is having his behaviour regulated on a regular basis.</p> <p>Are the parents agreeable? Yes</p> <p>Attendance The percentage for absences has a difference of 0.7% higher. This is due to the school opening for the day when the snow came and 71 children who did not attend. The attendance at 96% which is above the national average.</p> <p>Was work sent out for the children to complete at home? Yes The schools aim is to open whenever possible to help the parents who work.</p> <p>Early Years The school will be moderated this year for the foundation year and the teachers involved have been on training.</p> <p>What is the moderation for? This is to make sure the teachers are using the correct formula to mark the children.</p> <p>Roll AD will re issue the roll as this is different than the data given to Governors. There are 2 girls starting after Easter, one in the foundation year and a year 2 child.</p> <p>Staffing How many MTA are there? Four and they have the highest unpaid absences as their paid work is in the middle of the day. Compassionate days have doubled due to personal time off for MTS staff. The staff absences will be reviewed again in the autumn term.</p> <p>Finance How was the Petroc meeting? Passionate and political at times. The rubber crumb on the trim trail was discussed and quotes are being sought.</p> <p>How are the books being chosen?</p>	<p>AD</p> <p>AD</p>
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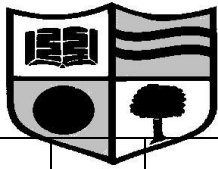

There is more money from the MSA from other fund raising which could be used for books.</p> <p>Kitchen and Meals The 'net' contribution this year is about £3000 and this was compared to two local schools who do not use the same contractor. One school net cost was £2300 and the other net cost was £12075 which was due to the school having two sites and one kitchen.</p> <p>Devon Primary SCITT Whether to have a trainee next year or not, as although there is money which is used for supply, was discussed amongst the Governors.</p> <p>What is the commitment for Laura? Every Thursday afternoon about 2 hours but this can be more with meetings.</p> <p>Is it helpful to have an extra pair of hands? Yes when the trainee is a good trainee. CPD training from trainees has helped the school as costly to send staff on courses.</p>

The school's finance officer has been in school today to work with Sue East.</p> <p>Looking at the budget monitor there is a carry forward is £32,753 which is healthy but £15,000 is for the electricity bill that is still being discussed with the company. There is also some Sport Premium money to be carried forward so the actual carry forward is about £8 – 9,000 which is higher than expected. The charts were explained to the Governors. The inflation costs have been added and there may be a higher rise in salaries which will not be funded.</p> <p>Is the income based on the roll of 117? Yes</p> <p>Do County look for budgets that are not realistic?</p>	

			<p>County are aware of the way schools compose their budgets. The school has to be confident that the budget set will be within the income the school receives.</p> <p>The budget is good for the school while the numbers in the school remain the same.</p> <p>The school have had the list of potential first preferences but there are no actual names. The PAN will remain at 18 for the year but any children coming into the catchment area will be considered.</p> <p>AD would like the interim budget agreed at this meeting.</p> <p>Proposed LQ, Seconded LY and All the Governors agreed.</p> <p>The Governors agreed that the budget can be set at the finance sub meeting in May by the Governors who attend that meeting.</p>
