

Dear Parent / Carer

It has been a real pleasure for all the staff at school to welcome the children this week. Having a building full of children busily learning and a noisy playground is wonderful. The children are quickly settling into the new routines and we are working to make progress in learning.

Covid Secure routines.

Children are washing their hands on arrival and regularly throughout the day. They are also using hand sanitizer; as are the staff. Staff are not routinely wearing face coverings and other PPE, though they are available for first aid. Staff working one – to – one with children are wearing face visors and are keeping 1 metre + distance.

Covid 19 testing – there is a great deal in the news about the lack of availability of tests. Headteachers across the country are raising the issue. At the moment if someone in your household has Covid 19 symptoms: Cough and or raised temperature and or loss of smell / taste; then your whole family must isolate for 14 days. I have put an extended Covid 19 absence guide below.

A positive case at school may mean that the child's bubble (Classes 1 / 2 or Classes 3 / 4) are asked to isolate. Staff and I are working on what school work would be available and where we direct people to on Oak National Academy for the daily online lessons. The family of a child whose bubble has been asked to isolate do not need to isolate themselves unless symptoms develop. Brothers and sisters in the other bubble can continue to come to school.

I ask that you keep Marwood School informed of any family members with symptoms and the result of any Covid 19 tests.

Getting to and from school. I much appreciate everyone's patience as we use the three entrances into school. Class 1 parents using the car park are asked to wait until 8:30 before driving out of the car park to prevent cars trying to pass in the lane next to the Class 2 children's gate.

<u>Communication with classroom staff</u>. Please use the staff email addresses if you need to contact staff who teach your child.

Class 1 have a request: If anyone has any empty 'top' pump refillable soap dispensers they would much appreciate them.

The children have come into school with a great enthusiasm and are ready to learn. I know that all families, staff and governors will continue to make their schooling successful.
