World Book Day is on the 4th March and we thought it would be fun to take part in this competition set by the Babcock School Library Service as we can't celebrate in our usual way.

The challenge is to use any size roll (loo roll/kitchen roll/wrapping paper roll) and decorate it to represent your favourite character or book.

The Brief:

- The design should be created using cardboard tubes whilst in their original cylindrical shape – that's the challenge!
- The tubes cannot be wrapped in paper but it is acceptable to stick things on to create the design.
- The design should represent your favourite book character or book.
- Any size cardboard tube is acceptable e.g. kitchen roll tube, wrapping paper tube.
- Any medium can be used to achieve this e.g. felt tip, ink, paint, collage.

- Yr5/6


There will be a prize for each category in school. The winners will then be submitted for the Devon-wide competition.
